**D. G. CHRISTIAN JERNSTEDT TO SPEAK AT LANDMARK COLLEGE**

**Putney, VT – April 16, 2007** Teaching in the 21<sup>st</sup> century is challenging, but educators now have a wealth of information about the brain and learning to guide their work.

Recent research in cognitive science will be the topic of a full day presentation at Landmark College on **Thursday, April 26th**. Dr. Christian G. Jernstedt, distinguished Professor of Psychological and Brain Sciences at Dartmouth College, will talk about “The Neurological and Cognitive Foundations of Learning.” The event, which takes place from **8:30AM – 3:30PM** in the Greenhoe Auditorium, is co-sponsored by the Landmark College Institute for Research and Training and the Southeast Vermont Learning Collaborative. Dr. Jernstedt's research is in the area of learning as it occurs both in formal classroom settings and in the natural environment. This research is directed towards understanding the cognitive, behavioral, and affective aspects of learning experiences. Dr. Jernstedt's research includes classroom and other intentional learning, technologically enhanced learning, service-learning, and experiential learning programs. Dr. Jernstedt is a dynamic speaker who draws on his own classroom experiences in linking research to teaching.
