

The Need

Students often do not realize how different college is from high school. Without a fundamental understanding of the expectations, environment, and rigor at the college level, they are likely to struggle in their efforts to achieve academic success.

Who Should Enroll?

College-bound high school juniors and seniors, and PG students (postgraduates still affiliated with a high school) who struggle with learning primarily due to:

- Learning disabilities (such as dyslexia)
- ADHD
- Autism
- Executive function challenges

Disability documentation is not required by Landmark College to participate.
