Enrolled students can earn associate and bachelor's degrees in a growing number of fields while getting a comprehensive college experience on our campus in Putney, Vermont, or through our LC Online programs. Our students participate in internships, study abroad programs, faculty-student discovery research, and more. We also offer short-term programs that help high school and new college students transition into challenging environments, and professional development opportunities for professionals and educators who work with neurodivergent students.

As society evolves to embrace all forms of diversity, it is imperative that we understand the positive effects of an inclusive, neurodiverse population as well. "Neurodiversity" describes neurological differences, such as those evident in individuals with learning difficulties, as the result of natural variations, rather than deficits. 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
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
