

Contract Let For Buildings

College to Erect 2 Dormitories

PUTNEY — President Eugene C. Winslow of Windham College signed a contract yesterday with Arthur Monahon, president of the John F. Griffin Co. of Cambridge, Mass., to construct two new dormitories on the Edward Durell Stone campus.

These dormitories are being financed for the college by the Housing and Home Finance Agency at a total cost of \$1,140,000.

Flora Hendricks Hall, named for the wife of the founder of Windham, Dr. Walter Hendricks, will house 90 women. Edward Durell Stone Hall, named for the designer of the campus, will house 90 men. With the completion of these two buildings, only three dormitories remain to be constructed.

The first floor of each building will have a southeast exposure to the Connecticut River Valley. This area in Flora Hendricks Hall will house cafeteria facilities to accommodate next year's expected student enrollment of 550, while in infirmary and extensive lounge area are planned for Edward Durell Stone Hall. Fireplaces will be included in both buildings.

Construction will begin next week with the completion date set for Sept. 15, 1966.

On Tuesday, Oct. 26, Windham College will make available plans for the Dorothy Culbertson Marvin Memorial Library. Bids for which will be opened Nov. 16. The cost for the building and equipment will be \$440,000. An \$800,000 science building and a student union are also planned for construction in 1966.
